## PARISH FOOTPATH FOCUS

There are some wonderful walks around the parish but sometimes the footpaths are misused so here is just a little reminder about how to 'treat' our natural walkways.

We must all make sure that we 'leave no trace' and the way to do this is to stick to the routes that are right for your sort of transport – your feet, a bike, or a horse.

### Public footpaths

These are for feet or using a mobility aid but nothing bigger - no bikes or horses! These are marked by yellow arrows or wooden signs that say FOOTPATH.

Some landowners/farmers do allow people to ride horses on their land, however riders are NOT ALLOWED on the actual footpath - they can ride alongside the footpath but it is illegal to ride on any footpath itself.

### Bridleways

Horses are allowed on bridleways and also those on foot, using mobility scooters/ wheelchairs as well as cyclists. These paths are stile-free/gate free. These have a blue arrow or a sign staying BRIDLEWAY.

### Restricted byways

These are open to the same groups as bridleways (walkers, mobility vehicle users, horse- and bike-riders) with just the addition of anyone travelling in a horse-drawn vehicle. Sometimes there may be the odd farm vehicle that will use these. These have a purple arrow.

### Byways open to all traffic (BOATs)

These permit all the same users as the restricted byways but also allow motor vehicles, motorbikes, cars or vans. They have a red arrow.

### Permissive Paths

These are pathways that you're allowed to use because the person who privately owns that land has made the route available to the public. Take note of any restrictions

## Volunteering Working Groups

Amport Parish Council is planning to do tree-felling of dead and fallen trees on the green and in the fen on **16 March** weather permitting. A couple of fit volunteers who can assist in clearing and stacking the felled trees would be welcome.

Meet at 9 am at the south-east corner of the green and bring sturdy footwear and gloves.

## WEYHILL AREA

### Weyhill Noticeboard

The new noticeboard is to be located on land at the entrance to Fairways. This has been ordered and paid for by Amport Parish Council and Aster have kindly given the Parish Council permission to put it on their land. It will be put in place as soon as we receive delivery.

### Weyhill Community Land

Amport Parish Council are looking at whether land could be acquired in Weyhill for community purposes eg: village green. The PC are exploring TVBC grants and identifying landowners.

### Planning

In recent years, your Parish Council has developed good relationships with other neighbouring parishes. This means that where planning issues potentially involve more than one parish - a prime example being the Dauntsey Lane area in Weyhill - the PC is co-operating with the neighbouring parishes with the objective that submissions from residents in the Parish can be made to the planning authority. This is an ongoing initiative.

## February meeting in brief

Play Equipment - repair to take place soon and APC are getting quotes for new goal posts for the green.

Highways - Amport Parish Council continues to correspond regarding problems around the parish that have been reported - in particular to the damage at the junction of Amesbury Road and Fyfield Road at Weyhill and of course potholes!

Water Testing - There is an initiative to test the water in the Pill Hill Brook and testing kits are being obtained from the Angling Trust Some. Funding has been obtained from Southern Water and local businesses and Parish Councils are being asked to pay the balance.

Social Media - Amport Parish Council has a code of conduct in place surrounding social media posts and will not tolerate any abuse on social media whether directed at the parish council or other parish individuals.

# Neighbourhood Plan

The NP is progressing well. There are now 3 active working groups (WGs) identifying protected views and green spaces amongst other things.

The main framework of the plan has been written and the WGs are gathering evidence from parishioners about what they want to see in it. There will be a number of community engagement activities where parishioners can meet and share their views with WGs. These will be incorporated into the plan.

The Weyhill Working Group is being lead by Anthony Putt and Clare Hemmings, East Cholderton by Geraldine Grimshaw and Ampport by Robert Talbot Rice. We are fortunate to have just over 20 volunteers who are working hard to put the plan together. When in place every planning application will have to reference the NP. We will publish Community Engagement meetings on social media, Ampport Parish Website and Parish Pages.

## FIBRE CONNECTIONS

Efforts to bring Fibre to the Premises (FTTP) to give Ampport homes and businesses modern internet speeds have only been partially successful, and it is not yet clear when FTTP will be available to all Ampport residents.

Sarsons Close have had FTTP for some years now and during 2023 FTTP was extended to houses connected to the Abbots Ann exchange as part of the Abbots Ann Community Fibre Partnership scheme.

Houses in the remainder of the parish (which are connected to the Weyhill and Grateley exchanges) now fall under the Government's Project Gigabit scheme, which is an alternative to the Community Fibre Partnership. In July 2023 BDUK gave a contract to City Fibre to connect 76,000 premises in Hampshire. The risk is that City Fibre will concentrate on properties which are easier to connect.

The Parish Council has engaged with Test Valley, Hampshire County Council, and our MP, to ensure that our concerns with the failure to conclude the Gigabit Procurement Process are understood. Ampport residents who do not yet have the option of an FTTP connection might wish to register on the City Fibre website at <https://cityfibre.com> in order to receive their updates. As you will note when you go through the registration process, City Fibre say that they "haven't planned your area at the moment".
